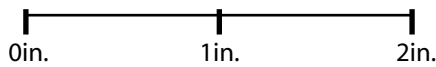


Check the scale

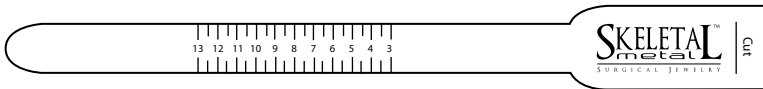
- Before you continue, we need to make sure this page was printed at the right scale.
- Measure our scale below. The scale should measure exactly two inches.



(note - If the scale does not measure two inches, check your printer preferences and make sure scaling is set to "none" or "do not scale". If your printer is "scaling to fit page", the measuring options below will not be accurate.)

Measure your finger - option A

- Carefully cut out the ring size measuring tool below, including the slit at the wider end. Wrap the measuring tool around the finger which will wear the new ring, and slide the narrow end through the slit.
- Take the measurement at the widest section of your finger. (usually the knuckle) Pull the measuring tool in tightly around your finger and read the number closest to the slit. This is your ring size.



(note - The best time to measure your ring size is in the evening when fingers are the largest. Do not measure cold fingers, which are at their smallest.)

Measure an existing ring - option B

- If you have a ring that fits the finger you are purchasing for, you can find its size using the chart below.
- Place your ring over the circles below. The circle that best matches the inner diameter of your ring is the size you should order.

(note - remember to match the inner diameter of your ring. Matching the outer diameter will result in a ring size that will be too big.)
